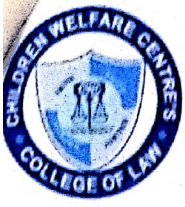

## Report on the Seminar: "The Role of Artificial Intelligence in Intellectual Property Law" on 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> January 2024

The Children Welfare Centre's College of Law recently organized a seminar on "The Role of Artificial Intelligence in Intellectual Property Law," which brought together legal scholars, students, and professionals to discuss the rapidly evolving intersection of technology and intellectual property (IP). 



Knowledge and continuance practice of such advocacy skills will help an advocate to be successful in his/her career.


At the end of the seminar students were given an opportunity to ask questions, there was active participation by the students. The queries raised by them were catered in detail by the speaker.
