Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on 15th July 2022 between **Children Welfare Centre's College of Law**, hereinafter referred to as the "**Home Institution**," and **Thakur Ramnarayan College of Law**, hereinafter referred to as the "**Host Institution**." The purpose of this MOU is to establish a framework for Research Collaboration between the two institutions, aiming to foster academic cooperation and promote cultural exchange.

- 1. Purpose and Objectives:** The primary purpose of this MOU is to foster cooperation and exchange of knowledge between our institutions/organizations in the field of Research Area. The key objectives of our collaboration are as follows:
 - Conduct joint research projects, studies, and experiments.
 - Exchange scientific information, publications, and research findings.
 - Organize seminars, workshops, and conferences on relevant topics.
 - Facilitate the exchange of researchers, faculty members, and students.
 - Share research facilities, equipment, and resources, as appropriate.
 - Explore opportunities for joint funding applications and grant opportunities.
- 2. Terms of Collaboration:** The proposed collaboration shall commence on the effective date of this MOU and will remain in effect for a period of five years, unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement. It is essential to note that the MOU does not create any legally binding obligations, but rather serves as a framework to promote collaboration and cooperation.
- 3. Roles and Responsibilities:** Each party shall appoint a designated representative to oversee the implementation of this MOU and act as a point of contact for communication. The designated representatives will be responsible for coordinating research activities, arranging meetings, and facilitating any necessary administrative procedures.

4. **Intellectual Property Rights:** Intellectual Property (IP) generated during the course of joint research projects shall be governed by a separate agreement between the parties. Both parties commit to respect and protect each other's IP rights and shall negotiate in good faith to address any IP-related issues that may arise.
5. **Confidentiality:** Both parties understand the sensitivity of certain research information and agree to maintain strict confidentiality regarding any confidential or proprietary information shared during the collaboration.
6. **Termination:** Either party may terminate this MOU by providing written notice at least notice period of 30 days in advance. Upon termination, ongoing research projects and collaborations shall be completed, and both parties shall continue to respect any existing confidentiality obligations.
7. This Memorandum of Understanding constitutes the understanding between the Home Institution and the Host Institution regarding the student exchange program and supersedes all prior agreements or arrangements, whether oral or written.



This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on 15th July, 2022 between Children Welfare Centre's College of Law, located at Valnai Village, Marve Road, Orlem Bavadi Stop, Malad (West) Mumbai: 400064, hereinafter referred to as "Party A," and Thakur Ramnarayan College of Law, located at Thakur Ramnarayan Educational Campus, S.V. Road, Dahisar (East), Mumbai: 400068, hereinafter referred to as "Party B".

Preamble: Recognizing the importance of international academic collaboration and the benefits of faculty exchange in promoting academic and cultural understanding between our institutions, Party A and Party B hereby agree to establish a faculty exchange program based on the following terms and conditions.

Article 1: Purpose The purpose of this MOU is to promote academic collaboration, research cooperation, and faculty development between Children Welfare Centre's College of Law and Thakur Ramnarayan College of Law.

Article 2: Faculty Exchange Program.

1. Both parties agree to establish a faculty exchange program that will enable the exchange of teaching and research staff between their respective institutions.
2. Faculty members eligible for the exchange program shall be selected based on their academic qualifications, research expertise, and willingness to participate in the exchange.
3. **Article 3: Duration of Exchange** The duration of faculty exchange visits shall be determined for a period of five years. Exchange periods can vary from one semester to three academic year, subject to mutual agreement between the parties involved.

Article 4: Financial Provisions

1. Neither Party A nor Party B shall charge faculty exchange fees to the visiting faculty members during their exchange period.

Article 5: Responsibilities of the Sending Institution (Party A)

1. Party A shall nominate eligible faculty members for participation in the exchange program in consultation with Party B.
2. Party A shall ensure that selected faculty members have the necessary documents, including visas and work permits, for their exchange period at Party B's institution.

Article 6: Responsibilities of the Host Institution (Party B)

1. Party B shall provide visiting faculty members with suitable working facilities, resources, and support needed to conduct their teaching and research activities during the exchange period.
2. Party B shall appoint a designated contact person to assist visiting faculty members and facilitate their integration into the academic and social life at Party B's institution.

Article 7: Reporting and Evaluation

1. Both parties agree to regularly review and evaluate the effectiveness of the faculty exchange program and make necessary improvements.
2. Each party shall provide a comprehensive report on the exchange program, including the outcomes and achievements of the participating faculty members, at the end of each academic year.

Article 8: Intellectual Property Rights

1. Any intellectual property rights arising from joint research and collaborative activities shall be governed by a separate agreement between the involved parties.
2. Both parties shall respect and protect the intellectual property rights of the visiting faculty members during their exchange period.

Article 9: Termination Either party may terminate this MOU by providing written notice to the other party at least one month prior to the intended termination date.


Article 10: Amendments Any amendments to this MOU shall be made in writing and require the mutual consent of both parties.



This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on 15th July, 2022 between **Children Welfare Centre's College of Law**, located at Valnai Village, Marve Road, Orlem Bavadi Stop, Malad (West) Mumbai: 400064, hereinafter referred to as the "**Home Institution**," and, **Thakur Ramnarayan College of Law**, located at Thakur Ramnarayan Educational Campus, S.V. Road, Dahisar (East), Mumbai: 400068, hereinafter referred to as the "**Host Institution**." The purpose of this MOU is to establish a framework for a student exchange program between the two institutions, aiming to foster academic cooperation and promote cultural exchange.

1. **Purpose:** The purpose of this MOU is to facilitate the exchange of students between the Home Institution and the Host Institution. This exchange program aims to promote international education, enhance academic experience, and foster intercultural understanding among students from both institutions.
2. **Duration:** This MOU shall be effective from [15th July, 2022] and shall remain in force for a period of five years, unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement or in accordance with the provisions stated herein.
3. **Student Exchange:**
 - 3.1 **Number of Students:** Both institutions shall agree on the number of students to be exchanged annually, considering the available resources and facilities at both institutions.

3.2 Eligibility and Selection: Each institution shall be responsible for selecting their respective students for the exchange program such as Moot Court competition, Para Legal Training etc. Eligibility criteria, application procedures, and deadlines shall be communicated between the institutions in a timely manner.

3.3 Coursework and Credit Transfer: The participating students will be allowed to enroll in the courses offered by the host institution during the exchange period. The courses taken by the students will be recognized by the home institution, subject to pre-determined credit transfer guidelines.

3.4 Academic Support: The host institution shall provide academic support and guidance to the visiting students during their exchange period, ensuring a fulfilling and successful learning experience.

4. Financial Arrangements:

4.1 Tuition Fees: Students participating in the exchange program shall be exempted from paying student exchange fees at the host institution. However, they shall remain liable for any applicable fees at the home institution.

4.2 Travel Expenses: Students shall bear the costs of their travel expenses and other related expenses.

5. Administrative Arrangements:

5.1 Student Support: Both institutions shall appoint a designated coordinator to facilitate the exchange program and serve as a point of contact for participating students.

6. **Evaluation and Review:** Both institutions shall regularly review and evaluate the effectiveness of the exchange program to make necessary improvements and ensure its continued success.

7. **Termination:** Either institution may terminate this MOU with a written notice of one month to the other party. Termination shall not affect the completion of any ongoing student exchange at the time of notice.

8. **Amendments:** Any amendments or modifications to this MOU shall be made in writing and shall be mutually agreed upon by both institutions.

9. **Confidentiality:** All information shared during the collaboration and implementation of the student exchange program shall be treated with strict confidentiality.






