RULES & REGULATIONS FOR SPORTS

1. CHESS

Rules

- 1st Round will be Elimination Round one Board of 2 students for 5 minutes.
- 2nd Round will be Quarter final one Board of 2 students for 5 minutes.
- 3rd Round will be Semi Finals one Board of 2 students for 15 minutes.
- 4th Round will be Final Round one Board of 2 students.

2. CARROM

Rules

- 1st Round will be Elimination Round One Board of 2 students for 10 minutes and students scoring high point will be winner.
- 2nd Round will Semi Final Round Two Board of 2 Students for 7 points per Board of 10 minutes.
